



Sustainability is the first of JSTOR's Thematic Collections, featuring academic and policy research on environmental stresses and their impact on society.

COMPLETE ARCHIVAL COVERAGE

All journals on JSTOR include the full archival run of every title, back to volume 1, issue 1.

ARCHIVAL JOURNALS WHAT'S INCLUDED?

All issues, from volume 1, issue 1, are provided for every journal up to the moving wall, including all previous and related titles.

Each journal has a "moving wall," defined as a time lag between the most current issue published and the content available on JSTOR. Most archival journals have moving walls of between 3 and 5 years, but publishers may elect walls anywhere from zero to 10 years.

JSTOR FEES DEFINED

There are two types of fees invoiced for archival journal collections:

Archive Capital Fee (ACF)

A one-time fee per collection, invoiced when access starts.

Annual Access Fee (AAF)

A recurring fee invoiced on a calendar year basis.

One-Time Payment

JSTOR's one-time payment options ensure access to content without a recurring Annual Access Fee.

The One Time Payment option is available for select collections

One-time fees cannot be paid for collections already licensed at their institution.




